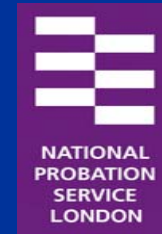

# Background



- The car park at the rear of the Princess Public House Leabridge Road Hackney is owned by Thames Waterways for the use of the community visiting the nature walks along the River Lee.
- The car park has been blighted by fly tip rubbish and anti-social behaviour for many months. The Leabridge Safer Neighbourhoods team in partnership with the London Probation Community Payback scheme have worked at the site since April 2007 to clear vegetation and fly tipped rubbish.
- The car park and the entrance to the nature walk is now useable for the community. Enforcement activity against fly tippers will be carried out to assist long-term prevention and plans are in place for the nearby pub to purchase the car park and install an access gate.
